A 5-year-old boy who had been riding a bike was hit the leg. A 29-year-old man had been shot multiple times. Marcus Solis has the latest.

NEWBURGH, New York (WABC) -- Isaac Peacock is smiling despite lying in a hospital bed with a gunshot wound to his leg.

The 5-year-old was riding his bike in Newburgh just after 7:00 p.m. on Thursday when he was struck.

Both victims were rushed in police cars to St. Luke's Hospital in Newburgh where the 29-year-old was pronounced dead. After being stabilized, the boy was airlifted to Westchester Medical Center.

The motive for the shooting remains unclear and it's not known if Corbett, who relatives say survived being shot in January, was the intended target.

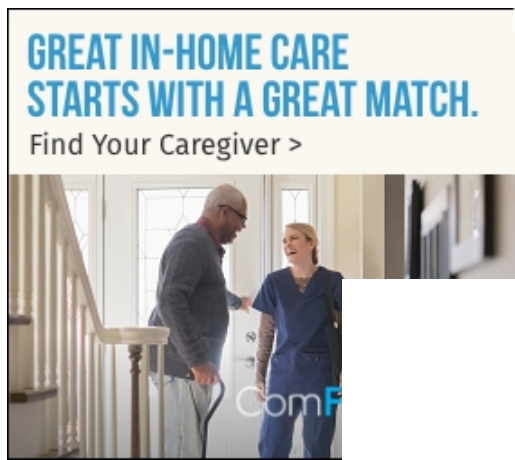
